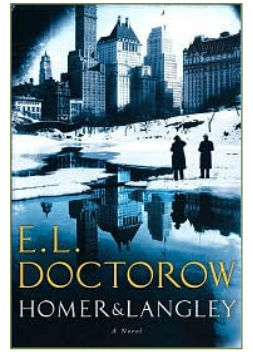

Is it a collection or is it clutter? Rose-Mary Rumbley will give a hilarious review of these three books about hoarding. Come prepared to laugh a lot!

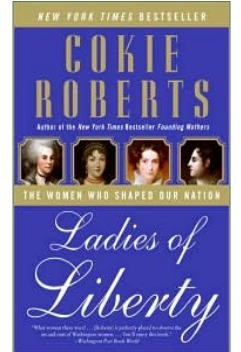

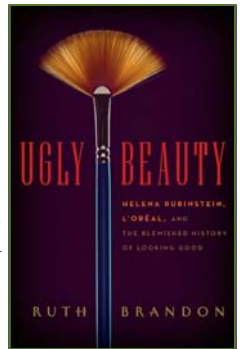

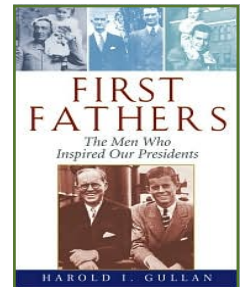
